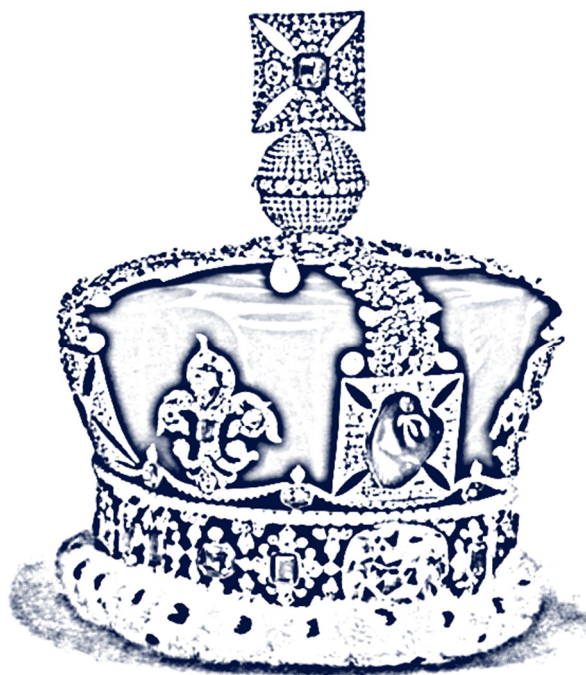

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# Introduction

**R**oyal Ascot Statistics and Trends is my second publication after *"The Little Book Of Aintree Grand National Festival Statistics 2023"*, that volume, while successful in its content, was very much a slimmed down version of what you are about to embark on here.

This 2023 edition covers all 35 races of the Royal Ascot Festival with statistics and trends for the previous 12 years – 2011 to 2022.

By considering the various trends and patterns that have emerged from previous Royal Ascots, betting enthusiasts and horse racing enthusiasts alike can better predict the outcome of the races.

Factors such as horses age, betting market, previous race, previous Ascot form, previous distance form, official rating, group race wins, starting stall and current season form all play a crucial role in determining a horse's chances of success.

By analysing these factors enthusiasts can increase their chances of winning and enjoying the thrill of one of the most exciting horse racing festivals in the world.

Statistics are a powerful tool for analysing and interpreting data. They provide objective measurements and insights that can help us make informed decisions and draw meaningful conclusions. By using statistical techniques, we can summarise data, identify patterns and trends, test hypotheses, and make predictions.

However, it is important to remember that while statistics can provide valuable information, they can also be misleading if not used correctly or if the data is misinterpreted. It is crucial to apply statistical methods appropriately, consider the limitations of the data, and critically evaluate the results.

That said, statistics can play a significant role in helping us understand what is required to win certain races and therefore making informed predictions and decisions.

Royal Ascot Statistics and Trends will not hand you every winner at Royal Ascot on a plate but it will help you eliminate several contenders so that you are left with a shortlist, generally the winner will be found in this pool but this is horse racing and there are always exceptions to the rule.

## The Queen Anne Stakes (Group 1)

The Queen Anne Stakes is a Group 1 flat horse race held annually during the Royal Ascot meeting in England. It is open to horses aged four years or older and run over one mile. The race was named after Queen Anne, the founder of Ascot Racecourse, and was first run in 1840. It is traditionally the opening race of the Royal Ascot meeting and is considered one of the most prestigious mile races in the world. Some of the greatest horses in racing history have won the Queen Anne Stakes, including Frankel and Solow. It is a race that is eagerly anticipated by racing enthusiasts and punters alike and is known for producing thrilling finishes and upsets.

# The Queen Anne Stakes – Statistics and Trends

**Horses Age** – 9 of the previous 12 winners were aged 4.

**Betting Market** – 7 of the previous 12 winners have been favourites, **10 of the 12 winners have been in the top 3 in the betting market**. Starting price of the winner has ranged from 1/10 to 33/1 but 9 of the winners were priced under 11/2.

**Previous Race** – 7 of the previous 12 winners won on their previous race before the Queen Anne Stakes, 10 of the previous 12 winners ran within the previous 38 days. 8 of the previous 12 winners had raced at Newbury on their previous outing.

**Ascot Form** – 9 of the previous 12 winners having had at least one previous race at Ascot and all those 9 had least one previous win at the course.

**Distance Form** – 11 of the 12 winners had at least 4 previous races over a mile, 11/12 winners had at least 1 previous win over 8 a mile.

**Flat Form** – **11 of the 12 winners had raced at least 7 times and won at least 4 times**.

**Official Rating** – **All of the previous 12 winners had an official rating of between 109 and 138. With 8 of them being 121 or higher**

**Group Race Wins** – 9 of the 12 winners had at least 1 win in a Group 1 race.

**Current Season** – **10 of the 12 winners had at least 1 previous race that season**, while 8 of those 10 had at least 1 previous win that season.

**Draw** – The stall numbers of the winners over the previous 12 years have ranged from 1 to 12. **10 of them have been 8 or less**.

**Headgear** – **11 of the 12 winners have been without headgear**.

**Horses Sex** – 9 of the previous 12 winners were colts and 2 were geldings with just one mare winning.

Based on the statistics and trends for The Queen Anne Stakes, it appears that 4-year-old horses have a good chance of winning, and it's worth considering horses that have won their previous race and raced within the previous 38 days. Previous form at Ascot and over a mile is also a good indicator of success. It is also important to consider the horse's official rating, with winners typically having a rating of 109 or higher, and their Group Race Wins. In terms of betting, favourites, and horses in the top 3 in the betting market have a good track record of success, and it's worth noting that starting prices 9 of the 12 winners returned a starting price of 11/2 or less. Finally, most of the winners were colts or geldings without headgear.

## The Coventry Stakes (Group 2)

The Coventry Stakes is one of the most highly anticipated races of the Royal Ascot meeting. It is a Group 2 flat race for two-year-old horses, run over six furlongs. The race is named after the 9th Earl of Coventry, who was a keen supporter of horse racing.

The Coventry Stakes has a rich history, with its inaugural running taking place way back in 1890. Over the years, it has become a breeding ground for some of the best sprinters in the world, with many of its winners going on to enjoy successful careers on the international stage.

The race is always hotly contested, with some of the best two-year-old colts and fillies from around the world competing for the prize money and prestige that comes with a victory at Royal Ascot. The race has produced some truly memorable moments, such as the 2018 edition, which saw Calyx produce a stunning performance to win by over a length.

# The Coventry Stakes – Statistics and Trends

**Horses Age** – The race is only open to 2-year-olds.

**Betting Market** – Just 4 of the previous 12 winners have been favourites, 7 of the 12 winners have been in the top 3 in the betting market. Starting price of the winner has ranged from 13/8 to 150/1 but 8 of the winners were priced at 8/1 or less.

**Previous Race** – 11 of the previous 12 winners won on their previous outing before the Coventry Stakes, 11 of the previous 12 winners ran within the previous 32 days.

**Ascot Form** – 11 of the previous 12 winners had never previously raced at Ascot.

**Distance Form** – 9 of the 12 winners had raced either once or twice over six furlongs, 8 of them had won once or twice at the trip.

**Flat Form** – All of the 12 winners had at least one previous race and 11 of them had recorded at least one win.

**Official Rating** – *None of the 12 winners had been allocated an official rating.*

**Group Race Wins** – None of the 12 winners had won a Group race..

**Current Season** – All of the 12 winners had at least one race that season and 11 of them had recorded at least one win in that time.

**Draw** – The stall numbers of the winners over the previous 12 years have ranged from 1 to 22 with no pattern emerging as to the best position.

**Headgear** – None of the 12 winners wore headgear.

**Horses Sex** – All of the previous 12 winners were colts.

Based on the statistics provided, the Coventry Stakes at Royal Ascot the winner is likely to be a colt who has had at least one previous race and have recorded at least one win. Most of the winners have had a recent race, winning their previous race before the Coventry Stakes and running within the previous 32 days. In terms of betting market, favourites have won only 4 of the previous 12 races, while 7 winners have been in the top 3 in the betting market. It is also notable that none of the winners had been allocated an official rating or won a Group race. Finally, there seems to be no pattern emerging in terms of the best stall position or draw for the winners, and none of them have worn headgear.

## The King's Stand Stakes (Group 1)

The King's Stand Stakes is Group 1 flat horse race that takes place annually during the Royal Ascot meeting. The race is open to thoroughbreds aged three years or older, and it is run over five furlongs on the straight turf course at Ascot.

The King's Stand Stakes is known for its competitive field and its long history of producing some of the best sprinters in the world. The race was first run in 1860 and has since become one of the most important sprint races on the international racing calendar, attracting top-class horses from around the globe.

Over the years, the King's Stand Stakes has been won by many great horses, including the likes of Goldikova, Dayjur, and Choisir. The race has also produced some unforgettable moments, such as when the legendary sprinter, Lester Piggott, rode the mare, Ebn-Ali, to victory in 1972.

Overall, the King's Stand Stakes is a true test of speed and skill, it remains one of the most eagerly anticipated races in the horse racing world.

# The Kings Stand Stakes – Statistics and Trends

**Horses Age** – 9 of the previous 12 winners were aged between 5 and 7.

**Betting Market** – Just 1 of the previous 12 winners has been favourite, 8 of the 12 winners have been in the top 3 in the betting market. Starting price of the winner has ranged from 5/6 to 20/1 but 8 of the winners were priced at 6/1 or less.

**Previous Race** – 6 of the previous 12 winners won on their previous outing, 9 of the winners finished in the first 4 previous time. **10 of the previous 12 winners ran between 24 and 80 days ago.**

**Ascot Form** – 10 of the previous 12 winners had had at least 1 race at Ascot. 6 of them had a previous win at Ascot.

**Distance Form** – 9 of the 12 winners had raced at least 4 times over 5 furlongs, **10 of them had won once or more at the trip.**

**Flat Form** – 11 of the 12 winners had at least 12 previous races and all of them had recorded at least 4 wins.

**Official Rating** – The 12 winners had an official rating of between 111 and 126.

**Group Race Wins** – 11 of the 12 winners had won a Group race. 7 of them a Group 1.

**Current Season** – 11 of the 12 winners had at least one race that season and 8 of them had recorded at least one win in that time.

**Draw** – The stall numbers of the winners over the previous 12 years have ranged from 1 to 14.

**Headgear** – 10 of the 12 winners were without headgear, the other 2 wore cheekpieces.

**Horses Sex** – 8 of the previous 12 winners were geldings with 2 colts, 1 horse and 1 filly.

Based on the statistics provided, certain trends can be observed in the Kings Stand Stakes at Royal Ascot. Horses aged between 5 and 7 have won 9 of the previous 12 races, while only one favourite has won in the past 12 years. Most winners have been priced at 6/1 or less and come from the top 3 in the betting market. Additionally, winners have usually won or placed in their previous race and have had at least one race at Ascot. They have also had previous experience running over 5 furlongs and have had a good record of wins. They have also recorded an official rating between 111 and 126, and have won at least one Group race, with a preference for Group 1 races. Finally, they have had a race in the current season, with most recording at least one win during that time.

## The St James's Palace Stakes (Group 1)

The St James's Palace Stakes is a Group 1 horse race that occurs every year during the Royal Ascot event in England. It is exclusively for three-year-old colts and covers 1 mile.

This race was established in 1834 and derived its name from St James's Palace, which is a royal residence located in London. Over the years, this race has consistently attracted some of the finest European milers, showcasing the talents of exceptional horses.

Among the winners is the legendary Frankel, widely regarded as one of the greatest racehorses in history. Other notable victors include Kingman, Gleneagles, Barney Roy, and Without Parole.

# The St James's Palace Stakes – Statistics and Trends

**Horses Age** – This race is for 3-year-olds only.

**Betting Market** – 7 of the previous 12 winners have been the race favourite, **10 of the 12 winners have been in the top 3 in the betting market**. Starting price of the winner has ranged from 30/100 to 10/1 but 9 of the winners were priced at 4/1 or less.

**Previous Race** – 6 of the previous 12 winners won on their previous outing, 9 of the winners finished either first or second previous time. **All the previous 12 winners ran between 14 and 45 days ago**.

**Ascot Form** – Just 2 of the previous 12 winners previously raced at Ascot. Both had a previous win at Ascot.

**Distance Form** – **11 of the 12 winners had raced at least once over a mile, 11 of them had won at least once at the trip**.

**Flat Form** – All of the 12 winners had at least 3 previous races and 11 of them had recorded at least 2 wins.

**Official Rating** – The 12 winners had an official rating of between 109 and 130.

**Group Race Wins** – 8 of the 12 winners had won a Group race. 7 of them a Group 1.

**Current Season** – All of the 12 winners had at least one race that season and 11 of them had recorded at least one win in that time.

**Draw** – 11 of the winners over the previous 12 years have been drawn between 1 and 7.

**Headgear** – 11 of the 12 winners were without headgear, the other wore blinkers.

**Horses Sex** – This race is restricted to colts.

Based on the statistics provided, the St. James's Palace Stakes, exhibits several trends that can guide betting decisions. Favourable factors include being towards the top in the betting market, recent form with a win or close finish, experience over the race distance of a mile, solid flat form with multiple previous races and wins, a competitive official rating, and success in Group races, particularly at the Group 1 level. While previous experience at Ascot is not a crucial factor, a favourable draw between 1 and 7 can be advantageous. Most winners did not wear headgear. These trends should be considered alongside other relevant factors to make well-informed selections for the race.

## The Ascot Stakes (Handicap) (Class 2)

The Ascot Stakes is a flat handicap held annually during the Royal Ascot meeting, run over 2 miles and 3 ½ furlongs the race is open to horses aged four years old and above. It is a handicap race, which means that the horses carry different weights based on their official ratings, with the aim of creating a more level playing field.

The race was first established in 1838 and has since become a popular fixture at the Royal Ascot meeting, which is one of the most important events in the British horse racing calendar. The Ascot Stakes often features a large field of runners, and the competitive nature of the race makes it an exciting spectacle for both spectators and punters.

## The Ascot Stakes – Statistics and Trends

**Horses Age** – 10 of the previous 12 winners have been between 5 and 7.

**Betting Market** – Just 2 of the previous 12 winners have been the race favourite, 6 of the 12 winners have been in the top 4 in the betting market. The starting price of the winner has ranged from 4/1 to 66/1 but **11 of the winners were priced at 14/1 or less.**

**Previous Race** – 4 of previous 12 winners won their previous race, 7 of the winners finished in the first 3 previous time. **10 of the previous 12 winners ran between 17 and 52 days ago.**

**Ascot Form** – 6 of the previous 12 winners previously raced at Ascot. *None of the winners had a previous win at Ascot.*

**Distance Form** – All of the 12 winners had raced at least once over a distance of between 2 miles 1.5 furlongs and 3 miles, 11 of them had won at least once at 2 miles or more.

**Flat Form** – All of the 12 winners had at least 5 previous flat races and All of them had recorded at between 2 and 4 flat wins.

**Official Rating** – The 12 winners had an official rating of between 88 and 100.

**Weight Carried** – 10 of the 12 winners carried between 9st 3lb and 9st 10lb.

**Group Race Wins** – None of the previous 12 winners had won a Group race.

**Current Season** – All of the 12 winners had at least one race in the current season and 6 of them had recorded at least one win in that time.

**Draw** – No significant bias although 8 were drawn between 1 and 11 and the other 4 between 16 and 19.

**Headgear** – 8 of the 12 winners were without headgear.

**Horses Sex** – 9 of the 12 winners were geldings and the other 3 were mares.

Based on the statistics provided, the Ascot Stakes, ideal candidates for the Ascot Stakes are geldings aged between 5 and 7 with an official rating between 88 and 100, carrying between 9st 3lb and 9st 10lb and priced at 14/1 or less. Negatives are winning form at Ascot and winning Group Race form.

## The Wolferton Stakes (Listed)

The Wolferton Stakes is run over 1 mile 2 furlongs and 17 yards and is open to horses aged four years and older. It is named after Wolferton, village located near Sandringham House.

The race was first run in 2002 when Royal Ascot was extended to five days to celebrate the Golden Jubilee of Elizabeth II. Initially it was a handicap called the Wolferton Rated Stakes. In 2018 the race was moved to the opening Tuesday of Royal Ascot and the handicap element was removed to comply with a recommendation that no handicap should carry Listed status, making it a conventional Listed Race. Group 1 and 2 winners since the previous August are prohibited from entering. There are also weight penalties 5lbs for Group 3 winners, 3lbs for Listed winners (Since 31st August).

Due to that change of status in 2018 we need to ignore the data prior to then which means we can only use the previous five years of statistics.

## The Queen Mary Stakes (Group 2)

The Queen Mary Stakes is a Group 2 flat race open to two-year-old fillies. Run over 5 furlongs.

The race derives its name from Queen Mary, the consort of King George V. First run in 1921.

In 1971, the current race grading system was introduced, and for a period, the Queen Mary Stakes held a Group 3 classification. It was subsequently elevated to Group 2 status in 2004.

**Betting Market** – Just 4 of the previous 12 winners have been favourites, 8 of the 12 winners have been in the top 3 in the betting market. Starting price of the winner has ranged from 2/1 to 20/1 but 8 of the winners were priced at 8/1 or less.

**Previous Race** – 10 of the previous 12 winners won on their previous outing before the Queen Mary Stakes, 11 of the previous 12 winners ran within between 20 and 55 days ago.

**Ascot Form** – 11 of the previous 12 winners had never previously raced at Ascot. The one that had raced won her race.

It has been a residence of the British royal family since the 17th century and is currently the official London residence of the Prince and Princess of Wales, the Duke and Duchess of Gloucester, the Duke and Duchess of Kent, and Prince and Princess Michael of Kent.

Originally named the Windsor Forest Stakes, it was renamed in 2013 to honour Prince William, Duke of Cambridge (Now the Prince of Wales). Top jockey is William Buick with three wins, and the leading trainers are Sir Michael Stoute and John Gosden with four wins each.

The race is for horses aged four years or older. Introduced in 1862 in honour of the then Prince of Wales, later King Edward VII. There was no race between 1939 and 1968 when it was reinstated before the investiture of Prince Charles (now King Charles III) in 1969.

**Current Season** – **10 of the 12 winners had at least one race in the current season** and 9 of them had recorded at least one win in that time.

**Draw** – No significant bias.

**Headgear** – All of the 12 winners were without headgear.

Based on the statistics provided, the winner of the Prince of Wales's Stakes is likely to be a horse or colt, 4 years or 5 years old, with an official rating of between 119 and 125, not carrying a penalty. He will have finished in the first 3 previous time and return an SP of 11/2 or less.

## The Royal Hunt Cup (Heritage Handicap) (Class 2)

The Royal Hunt Cup is a flat handicap held annually during the Royal Ascot meeting, run over 1 mile the race is open to horses aged three years old and above. It is a handicap race, which means that the horses carry different weights based on their official ratings, with the aim of creating a more level playing field.

The race was first established in 1843, previously run over 7 furlongs it was extended to its current distance in 1956.

The Queen's Vase is a Group 2 flat race open to three-year-olds. Run over 1 mile 6 furlongs.

First run as a 2-mile race in 1840 the original prize was a gold vase donated by Queen Victoria..

**In 2017, the distance was reduced from 2 miles to the current trip of 1 mile 6 furlongs. Because of this we are limited to 6 years of data.**

The event is race in honour of the 4th Baron Ribblesdale, who served as the Master of the Buckhounds from 1892 to 1895. It was established in 1919, and it was originally a 1-mile race open to three and four-year-olds of either gender.

The race was abandoned throughout World War II, and after it returned its distance was extended to 1½ miles. It was restricted to three-year-old fillies in 1950.

The Ribblesdale Stakes often features fillies which ran previously in the Epsom Oaks.

Several remarkable horses have graced the winner's circle on multiple occasions, with Yeats emerging as the most successful, securing an unprecedented fourth victory in 2009.

The Buckingham Palace Stakes was revived in 2020 as part of an extended Royal Ascot festival implemented because racing had lost 10 weeks due to the Covid-19 pandemic. The race is now again a permanent fixture as the meeting was expanded to 7 races a day in 2021.

**Headgear** – 11 of the 12 winners were without headgear.

**Horses Sex** – 11 of the previous 12 winners were male. There have been 6 winning colts, 2 horses and 3 geldings. Plus 1 mare.

Based on the statistics provided for the Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes the pool of candidates are likely to be make, aged 4 or 5, a race within 56 days is pretty important as is winning experience at 6 furlongs. Winning Group race form is a plus as is an official rating between 112 and 120, any form of headgear is a negative.

## The Wokingham Stakes (Handicap) (Class 2) (0-110)

The Wokingham Stakes is a flat handicap held annually during the Royal Ascot meeting, run over 6 furlongs the race is open to aged three years and older.

The race takes its name from Wokingham a market town 7 miles from Ascot. The race was established in 1813. In 2020 for one year only there was a 'Silver Wokingham', an additional race as part of the extended Royal Ascot programme.

# The Wokingham Stakes – Statistics and Trends

**Horses Age** – 9 of the previous 12 winners have been aged 4 or 5.

**Betting Market** – Only 1 of the previous 12 winners has been the race favourite, 6 of the 12 winners have been in the top 4 in the betting market. **11 the previous 12 winners have returned a starting price between 15/2 and 33/1.**

**Previous Race** – 2 of previous 12 winners won their previous race, **9 of the previous 12 of the winners finished in the first 4 previous time.** 10 of the previous 12 winners ran between 14 and 42 days ago.

**Ascot Form** – **11 of the previous 12 winners had previously raced at Ascot.** 5 had won at Ascot.

**Distance Form** – **11 of the 12 winners had raced at least twice over a distance of 6 furlongs, 11 of them had won at least once at the trip.**

**Flat Form** – All of the 12 winners had at least 11 previous flat races and 10 of them had recorded at least 3 flat wins.

**Official Rating** – All of the previous 12 winners had an official rating of between 98 and 112.

**Weight Carried** – 11 of the 12 winners carried between 8st 13lb and 9st 9lb.

**Group Race Wins** – 2 of the previous 12 winners had won a Group race.

**Current Season** – **11 of the 12 winners had at least 1 race in the current season** and 3 of them had recorded at least one win in that time.

**Draw** – **11 of the previous 12 winners have been drawn between stalls 10 and 28.**

**Headgear** – 9 of the previous 12 winners were without headgear.

**Horses Sex** – 9 of the previous 12 winners were geldings and the others were 2 horses and a mare.

Based on the data provided, the shortlist for the Wokingham Stakes will mainly comprise of probably geldings but possible horses too aged 4 or 5 with a starting price between 15/ and 33/1, these horse will have previous raced between 14 and 42 days ago and finished in the first 4. A previous races at Ascot will be on their CV and they will be experienced racehorses with at least 11 races and 3 wins to their name. The allocated weight will be between 8st 13lb and 9st 9lb. They will have been allocated a starting stall between 10 and 28.

## The Golden Gate Stakes (Handicap) (Class 2) (0-105)

The Golden Gate Stakes is a flat handicap for three year olds run over 1 mile 2 furlongs at Royal Ascot.

First run in 2020 as part of the extended Royal Ascot programme.

## The Golden Gate Stakes – Statistics and Trends

This race was first run in 2020 therefore we have no trends.

## The Queen Alexandra Stakes (Conditions) (Class 2)

The Queen Alexandra Stakes is a conditions flat race open to four-year-olds and above. Run over 2 miles 6 furlongs.

Named after Queen Alexandra the consort of Edward VII the race was first run in 1864.

Traditionally the previous race on the final day of the five-day Royal Ascot meeting. It sometimes features horses which ran on the opening day in the Ascot Stakes, and the most recent to win both in the same year was Simenon in 2012.

It is the world's longest professional flat race, with a distance a few yards longer than that of the Marathon Handicap at Pontefract.

The race is often targeted by National Hunt trainers, most notably Willie Mullins who has won 4 of the previous 12 renewals.

# The Queen Alexandra Stakes – Statistics and Trends

**Horses Age** – 11 of the previous 12 winners have been aged between 6 and 9.

**Betting Market** – 2 of the previous 12 winners have been favourites, 10 of the previous 12 winners have been in the top 4 in the betting market. Starting price of the winner has ranged from 1/1 to 12/1 and 8 of the winners were priced 11/2 or lower.

**Previous Race** – 1 of the previous 12 winners won on their previous outing, 11 of the previous 12 winners had finished in the fifth or worse previous time. 9 of the previous 12 winners ran between 21 and 94 days ago. 9 of the previous 12 winners ran in a flat race previous time out.

**Ascot Form** – 10 of the previous 12 winners had previously raced at Ascot. 5 of them had won at Ascot.

**Distance Form** – All of the previous 12 winners had raced over at least 2 miles 1 furlong. All of them had won over at least 2 miles.

**Flat Form** – 10 the previous 12 winners had at least 14 previous races on the flat. All of them had recorded at least 2 wins on the flat. (This stat discounts any National Hunt Races).

**Official Rating** – All the previous 12 winners had an official rating between 95 and 112. 11 of the had a rating between 95 and 107.

**Group Race Wins** – Just 1 of the previous 12 winners had won a Group race.

**Current Season** – 8 of the previous 12 winners had at least one race on the flat in the current season and 2 of them had recorded at least one win in that time.

**Draw** – 8 of the previous 12 winners have been drawn 10 or higher, the other 4 were drawn 3 or lower.

**Headgear** – 8 of the previous 12 winners were without headgear, the other 4 wore cheekpieces.

**Horses Sex** – All of the previous 12 winners were geldings.

Based on the statistics provided for the Queen Alexandra Stakes we are looking for a gelding aged at least 6, fancied in the betting market but not necessarily favourite, he will likely have finished out of the first 4 previous time in a flat race and that race will have been between 21 and 94 days ago. He will probably have raced at Ascot in the past and had a win over at least 2 miles although it may not have been in a flat race. He will not be drawn between 4 and 9 and he will be wearing either no headgear or cheekpieces.
